LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Hello, fellow recyclers and reusers! I'm so happy to be able to say that the Hub had its second anniversary on April 1, 2023! In those two years, we've grown a lot. Our first employee was hired in November 2021, and we added our 8th and 9th employees in early March 2023. We outgrew the 21,000 square feet we originally started with to take on an additional 11,000 square feet in February 2023, which we use for our Makerspace and for additional storage. And we recently met our fundraising goal of \$15,000 so that we can once again take #1 thermoform plastics. (That is the #1 question (pun completely intended) we've received since we had to stop taking them in the fall of 2021 and we're so happy to have finally found a place where they will be recycled into new thermoforms!)

It's been a lot of work for a lot of people, but our efforts are paying off. We've had over 240 tons of material sent for recycling or taken for reuse, we've helped over 20 other nonprofits, and we've seen countless cool things that have been made from materials taken from the Hub. We could not have done all of that without your help. Whether you took things from our reuse space (we can't take in more things if things don't also go out!), volunteered during our regular hours or during an event, attended Hub-toberfest (our first ever fundraising event) or one of our craft nights, spread the word about the Hub to your friends and family, donated financially, or brought things to us for recycling – you had a positive impact and helped us decrease the amount of things going to the landfill by giving them second lives elsewhere. Thank you so much for helping us to grow and I can't wait to share some of our future plans soon!






WASTE DIVERTED

\$8,000 raised! 400 attendees! only 1 lb of waste!








2022 GROWTH
